SD54 is pleased to welcome Ms. Sandra McAulay back to the district in March and April, where she will work with a group of teachers on numeracy at the elementary level. Dr. Dean Kriellaars from the University of Manitoba will be coming to the district on February 17th to present a keynote and workshop on physical literacy and its relationship to mental wellbeing. Early incentive notices will be sent out at the beginning of February. CMC partnership continues in the second semester, with Intro to Health and Carpentry Foundations being offered.

District Update

- **District / Authority Scholarships** – We have received notification from the Ministry that the district has 18 scholarships available for distribution this year. Application packages have already been sent to the high schools and presentations will be scheduled for the week of May 15th. Deadline for applications is April 28th, 2023. Trustees interested in participating in the adjudication process are encouraged to notify Mr. Monkman.
- **K-12 Reporting**- Administrators recently began discussions about implementing the new standards coming from the Ministry of Education. Over the next few months, the District will be working with teachers around some upcoming changes.

Innovation / Initiatives

District Based Initiatives

- **Pink Shirt Day!** - On Wednesday, February 22th, 2023 schools across the district wore their pink shirts, and held a variety of activities and stood together to ERASE bullying!
- **New School Psychologist** – Ms. Stephanie Capyk was recently hired by the District. Ms. Capyk comes to the district via Alberta but previously lived in the valley several years ago. She has two children and their family is involved in beekeeping. The District is appreciative of the work done by the SBO staff, BCPSEA, BVTF and the BVTU to facilitate the hiring process.
- **Social / Emotional Teacher** - Mary Neto is providing two days/week support to teachers with a focus on incorporating wellness, social emotional learning into the curriculum, particularly literacy.
- **Book Club** - Ten people out last month to a Saturday morning Book Club. The participants are currently reading '*Self Compassion for Educators*'. Please contact Mary Neto for more information.
- **Professional Learning Numeracy Series** – Sandra McAulay will be back in the district March 9-10 to provide a professional development session on High Yield Numeracy Routines. She will be back in April for a session on Numeracy – Problem Solving.
- **Teacher Mentorship** – Mary Neto is also supporting the mentorship program two days/week and Cindy Miller connect is also working with some teachers.
- **Professional Learning Series (PLC)** - The next PLC session was held on Monday, February 27, 2023. Teachers gathered for professional reflection and awareness. Another night of insightful learning with SD54 colleagues.

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- **Dr. Dean Kriellaars Learning Session** – On the Friday, February 17th Pro-D day, the District collaborated with the BVTU Professional Development Committee to bring Dr. Dean Kriellaars into the district to make presentations to the staff and a wider public audience. Dr. Kriellaars message regarding Physical Literacy (which is a complete paradigm shift from traditional physical fitness) was tremendously well received by educators. Dr. Kriellaars also provided a Thursday evening community presentation and we anticipate there will be many positive ripples from his message felt in both our schools and communities in the future.

 - TimeCapsule Project – All students and staff contributing to the TimeCapsule which will close in a ceremony at the end of April. The theme for the time capsule is – *Where are we (SSS) today, through the Lens of Truth and Reconciliation.*
 - 19 students departed today for the Nass Valley for Hobiiyee
 - Drama class is off to Drama Zones in PR – they are taking the train
- **Twain Sullivan Elementary**
 - TEK Day at Irrigation Lake last Thursday. It was a glorious day full of sunshine and fun. The entire school participated and rotated through the following stations:

1. Draft 2022-2023 Amended Budget Review

Mr. Margerm advised the Committee that the District just received updated funding information related to the funded salary increases since July 1, 2022 given new union and employment contracts. This funding information was material in nature for the amended budget. Consequently, Mr. Margerm will review the 2022-2023 Amended Budget update at the February board meeting.

2. Draft 2023-2024, 2024-2025 Calendar Consultation

There was general agreement with moving the spring break holiday a week earlier.

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TRUSTEE REPORT

On Thursday Feb 16th I attended a presentation from Dr. Dean Kriellaars, Associate Professor, University of Manitoba pertaining to the concept of Physical Literacy. This session was geared to the general community, with a daylong session with SD 54 staff on the Friday February 17th.

What I learned from the presentation was that there is a difference between Physical Literacy and Activity. Kriellaars delved into the study of Physical Literacy as a way to determine how physical movement can have far overreaching benefits that can help people lead a productive life without as many health concerns. He explained how Physical Literacy and implementing of long-term strategies can be beneficial towards decreasing probability of long-term health concerns along with better mental health.

The strategy is straight forward and not necessarily something new but the data that is now coming out is indicating that the key to greater physical and mental health is helped by understanding Physical literacy. I am also impressed with Kriellaars understanding that this isn't a high-performance concept for elite athletes but a concept workable and important for all students as another form of literacy that provides the wisdom and blueprint to a healthier lifestyle for all students.
